CLERK: Senator, you voted. Thank you.

SPEAKER NICHOL: We're all here, Senator Schmit.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, let's have a roll call vote.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay. Roll call vote and the question is the adoption of the Schmit amendment. Mr. Clerk. Please hold the conversation down so we can hear.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See page 1972 of the Legislative Journal.) 24 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The motion fails. Do you have anything else, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Mr. President, the next amendment to the Enrollment and Review amendments is offered by Senator Lamb. (Lamb amendment is printed on page 1973 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Lamb, please. The call is raised.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, members, this...what page is this in the Journal, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Senator, this is...I don't have this in the Journal, Senator.

SENATOR LAMB: It's not in the Journal, but the identical one is in the Journal.

CLERK: Page 1962, Senator, 1962.

SENATOR LAMB: Thank you. Page 1962 is an identical resolution...or amendment. The only difference is the amendment I am offering now is an amendment to the E & R amendments. And that one in the Journal, on page 1962, was drafted as an amendment to a Hoagland amendment. Otherwise it is exactly the same. This is an amendment which is designed to try to make a bad bill just slightly better. I, of course, supported the Schmit amendment, would have preferred that that be adopted.
