CLERK: I have nothing further to Senator Hoagland's amendment, Mr. President.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Okay, Senator Hoagland, now we are back on your amendment.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Mr. Speaker and colleagues, this amendment strikes Section 11. This amendment that Senator Landis and I are presenting strikes Section 11 of the bill which are provisions that purport to change some of the liability provisions. I use the word change "inadvisedly". As I understand what this Section 11 of the bill does is it places in statutory form rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission with respect to the liability of telephone company employees and so forth. Some of these purported...some of the language has far-reaching implications. The proponents of the bill tell me they have no objection to taking it out because rules and regulations of the Public Service Commission make this same provision. On the other hand there are some of us that are quite concerned about this language because the effect of statutory law might be greater or different than its effect as a regulation by the Public Service Commission. I think Senator Lamb has expressed some concern about this provision. As I understand it there is general agreement that Section 11 should be removed from the bill. I'd ask the adoption of this amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator DeCamp, please on the Hoagland motion.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I have no objection. This merely does exactly what we said last week, or whenever we took this up. The bill is not intended, nor in any way remotely intended to remove liability for telephone trucks running down newspaper carriers. The liability section dealt, and is intended to deal, and does deal strictly with names in telephone books, as I said. Therefore, if there is any problem, question, I'll support the amendment, make it absolutely clear.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Schmit, please.

SENATOR SCHMIT: Senator Hoagland, would you yield please? If Section 11 is not removed from the bill, Senator Hoagland, will you support the bill?
