SENATOR LUNDY: Mr. President, I had a question of Senator Chronister.

SENATOR LUNDY: Senator Chronister, as I understand your amendment, I think it is strictly an optional type thing and it is not mandatory whatsoever, is that correct?

SENATOR CHRONISTER: That is true. I am glad you bring that out. It is optional. They can continue the way they are now or they can choose to go this way, Senator Lundy.

SENATOR LUNDY: Right. I think it is a fine amendment and I would support its adoption.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Senator Chronister, do you wish to close?

SENATOR CHRONISTER: No closing. I would hope we would adopt the amendment.

SPEAKER NICHOL: The question is the adoption of the Chronister amendment. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote on the Chronister amendment. Ladies and gentlemen, we must move along. Please vote on the amendment. Record, Mr. Clerk.
