

PRESIDENT: Senator Hoagland.

SENATOR HOAGLAND: I would offer at this time AM2977 which as been distributed. It adopts model penal code language so that we will have a bomb threat criminal statute in Nebraska which we currently do not have by virtue of a 1974 ruling by the Nebraska Supreme Court. I ask for the adoption of this amendment.

PRESIDENT: Is there discussion on the Hoagland amendment? Senator Chizek, you just want to speak on the bill, right? Senator Chambers, do you want to speak on the Hoagland amendment?

SENATOR CHAMBERS: I'd like to ask Senator Hoagland a question. Senator Hoagland, you said this is to make it a crime to make a bomb threat?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: That's right, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: Then you don't feel that on occasion there is a justifiable reason to make a bomb threat?

SENATOR HOAGLAND: Well, it's...yeah, I guess I agree with that, Senator Chambers.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: That's all, thank you.

PRESIDENT: Is there further discussion on the amendment? If not, Senator Hoagland, may I ask for a vote? Motion is to adopt the Hoagland amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Have you all voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of Senator Hoagland's amendment to the bill.

PRESIDENT: The Hoagland amendment is adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have nothing further to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Pirsch, do you...Senator Chizek, you want to speak on the bill. May we have order in the Chamber, please.
