CLERK: (Roll call vote taken. See pages 2168-69 of the Legislative Journal.) 27 ayes, 11 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: The amendment is adopted. Now, Senator DeCamp, Senator Hall, well, either one. Senator Hall, would you like to move the bill?

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President, I move that LB 603 be advanced to Select File and E & R for Engrossment.

SENATOR CARSTEN: All those in favor of advancing LB 603 will say aye. Those opposed no. The bill is advanced. Mr. Speaker, did you want to say something now? Not yet. Okay. We will move to LB 759. Excuse me.

CLERK: I have other amendments to 603, Senator.

SENATOR CARSTEN: Other amendments on the desk to 603. I'm sorry, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Senator DeCamp, am I to withdraw your other two? Mr. President, Senator Vard Johnson would move to return the bill for a specific amendment. (Senator Johnson's amendment appears on page 2169 of the Legislative Journal.)

SENATOR CARSTEN: Senator Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: Mr. Speaker and members of the Legislature, this issue is a very important issue to the life being of the Uniform Commercial Code and to the life being of central filing and our state has worked long and hard over the last three years under the guidance of Senator Wiley Remmers and the guidance of Senator John DeCamp and a lot of other people to develop a responsible system of dealing with secured credit transactions. For us to reject the continuing growth of central filing because we have suddenly become fearful of credit extenders in rural Nebraska is a terrible mistake. I understand how rural senators feel about maybe doing some harm to some rural businesses. I understand the depth of feeling and emotion on the double jeopardy question, but, by the same token, it truly is a major consequence to our state that we have a central filing uniform commercial code system. So I am offering the Rod Johnson amendment that was rejected except I am striking the emergency clause, that was in the amendment, and I am striking the
