ASSISTANT CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays to cease debate, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: The motion carries. Senator Warner, do you wish to close the argument? Someone wish to close the argument for Senator Warner? Senator Marsh.

SENATOR MARSH: Thank you, Mr. President, and members of the Legislature, we have taken the look ahead for the future of our state and that includes education and its ramifications. Some of the areas are having difficulty, more so than others. When we say, let them raise property taxes, we are being very shortsighted for we are not reducing taxes by refusing to add this. We simply are saying, switch it to the most objectionable kind of taxes. I urge your adoption of this amendment. I urge your adoption of the override motion for equity between our areas of higher education. I urge you to vote yes on the override.

PRESIDENT: The question is, shall this line-item veto concerning the technical community colleges be overridden? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. You are voting on the veto override motion concerning technical community colleges. Please record your vote aye or nay. Please record your vote. Line-item veto concerning community technical colleges. Motion to override. Please record your vote aye or nay. The Chair will allow 20 seconds for the recording of the vote. This is the technical community colleges bill. Ten seconds to record your vote aye or nay. Have you all voted? Have you voted? Record the vote, Mr. Clerk. Senator Nichol.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: Yes.

SPEAKER NICHOL: Mr. President, I ask for a roll call vote, please, and a call of the house.

PRESIDENT: Call of the house has been requested and a roll call vote has been requested also. The question now is, shall the house come under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote nay. Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays to go under call.
