CLERK: Senator Goodrich voting no. Senator Lowell Johnson voting no.

PRESIDENT: Have you all voted? Record the vote.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 15 nays on adoption of the amendment.

PRESIDENT: The amendment is adopted. We are back to the resolution as amended. Senator Miller, did you wish to speak on the resolution? Senator Lamb.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President, am I closing at this point?

PRESIDENT: Yes, you are. There are no other lights for recognition.

SENATOR LAMB: Okay, just very briefly I would say that this resolution has been crippled quite a bit, but it is better than it was before, so I just ask that the resolution be adopted.

PRESIDENT: Motion is to adopt the resolution, 440. All those in favor vote aye, opposed vote no. Voting on the adoption of LR 440 as amended. Please record your vote, aye or nay. We're voting on LR 440. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record the vote. Call of the house is raised.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 3 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the resolution.

PRESIDENT: The resolution is adopted. We proceed to LR 441. We'll pass over 441 and go to LR 443.

CLERK: Mr. President, 443 is a resolution offered by Senator John DeCamp.

PRESIDENT: Senator DeCamp, your resolution.

SENATOR DECAMP: Mr. President, I will try to be brief because I know we all want to get other places. I don't want the resolution to be seen for any more or any less than it is. The issue of the legal liability of Commonwealth has been settled. I think I, as much as anybody, have argued that and contended that. I think most of the work on Commonwealth thus far has been kind of an approach of who do we blame, and as long as people are so busy blaming each other they never could offer, in
