PRESIDENT: The motion carries.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next motion I have on a bill is by Senator Warner. Senator Warner would move to suspend Rule 6, Section 11 to permit consideration of an override of the Governor's veto of LB 778.

PRESIDENT: Are you handling this, Senator Warner? Senator Landis, your light was on. Is that for this debate? Very well. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I'll make it brief. It's late and several...

PRESIDENT: (Cavel.) May we have order, please. Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: ...several important things to do. I'm asking for a suspension of the rule. A motion was filed in ample time for the five-day rule. Because of the press of trying to get other things, I consistently indicated to the Speaker to pull it off so that other bills could be considered. And, I, in order to consider the override, I have to move to suspend the rule because the five-day limit has expired. If that is successful, I would move for the override.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: (response inaudible.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, do you wish to speak on the Warner motion?

SENATOR WESELY: Yes. I will oppose the override, but I will vote for the suspension of the rules. In fairness to Senator Warner, he did pass over this, giving us a chance to deal with some other legislation. So, in fairness, I think we ought to give him a chance to at least consider the issue. I will vote against it at that point, but I will give him a vote on this reconsideration or suspension motion.
