Mr. President, the next bill for consideration this morning is LB 149. It is a bill introduced by Senator Miller. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 9, referred to Transportation, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Miller, please.

SENATOR MILLER: Mr. President, and members, this bill has no fiscal impact. The main intent of this bill is to provide a more adequate data base for the Department of Motor Vehicles. It is a simple bill. It changes our present law which allows an exemption of certain motor vehicles that are not required to report an accident. All this bill does is it requires...eliminate that exemption of those automobiles. It requires all automobiles that are involved...all accidents to be reported. It is a very simple bill. It was brought to this body by the Department of Roads.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Miller. The Chair recognizes Senator McFarland on LB 149.

SENATOR MCFARLAND: Thank you, Mr. President. I had my light on on the previous bill so I do not wish to talk at this time. Thank you.
