

Chamber to deliver the State of the State Message and the Budget Message.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. Carries. The Escort Committee, Emil Beyer, will you be chairman? Senator Marsh, Senator Scofield, Senator Langford and Senator Labeledz, would you folks please serve on that committee. Will the committee please hold it up just a minute. I don't see Senator Labeledz. Senator Morehead, would you act as a substitute and be on that committee. We can't seem to find Senator Labeledz at the moment. Would you please do that for us? Thank you. Mr. Sergeant-at-Arms.

SERGEANT-AT-ARMS: Mr. President, the Governor of Nebraska.

PRESIDENT: Members of the Legislature, ladies and gentlemen, it is my privilege to introduce the first woman Governor in the State of Nebraska. I'm sure you are all aware of the significance of the past general election. Our Governor is here this morning to present her State of the State address. Ladies and gentlemen, may I present the Governor of the Great State of Nebraska, Kay Orr.

The committee would like to report LB 112 to General File with amendments attached; 255 to General File with amendments attached; LB 264 to General File with amendments attached and 91 indefinitely postponed, all those signed by Senator Wesely as Chair, Mr. President.
