LB 77, 152, 201, 228, 384A  
LR 28

Mr. President, your Committee on Judiciary whose Chair is Senator Chizek reports 77 to General File with amendments, and 228 as indefinitely postponed. Those are signed by Senator Chizek. (See pages 459-60 of the Legislative Journal.)

And, Mr. President, a new A bill, 384A by Senator Wesely. (Read for the first time by title.) And a new resolution, LR 28. (Read. See pages 461-62 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over, Mr. President. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

PRESIDENT: We will move on to LB 152, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, on LB 152, Senator Moore, I have no amendments to that bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move LB 152 be advanced.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All those in favor say aye. Opposed nay. It is advanced. LB 201.

CLERK: Senator, on 201, I do have E & R pending.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments to LB 201 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would now move to amend the bill. (See Wesely amendment on page 463 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. President, members, I did pass out for you a handout from Joanne Komenda, Director of Nebraska Pantry Network dealing with the amendment. The amendment, one of the sections in the bill, on page 2 dealing with labeling, of LB 201 would be struck under this amendment. The current bill deals with the cleanup in a number of areas and, actually, there is another bill, LB 544, dealing with the same...one of the
