

your vote in favor of LB 60. Thank you, Mr. Speaker.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Marsh. Any further discussion on the bill? Seeing no additional lights, the question is...correction, Senator Haberman, would you like to make a closing statement?

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President and members of the Legislature, to answer some of the concerns of Senator Lamb, Senator Lamb, at the present time a county employee or state employee can retire earlier than the age of 55 and withdraw a 100 percent of the employee account. They can already do what you are objecting to. They can already do this. So what I am saying is it's a good bill. I wouldn't be standing up here supporting the bill if I didn't believe in it and I will give you my word that it doesn't cost any money. Some of you may think my word is a little tarnished, but outside of that I will give it to you and ask that you advance the bill. Thank you, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Mr. Chairman. The question is, shall LB 60 be advanced to E & R? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the advancement of the bill? Please record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 30 ayes, 5 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. LB 75, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 75 was a bill introduced by Senator Landis. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 8, referred to the Transportation Committee, advanced to General File. I have no amendments pending at this time, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator David Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, I introduced LB 75 which is the product of some recommendations by the State Film Committee selected by Governor Kerrey several years ago following the successful filming of the "Terms of Endearment" film in Lincoln and in Nebraska. The purpose of the committee was to identify ways in which the State of Nebraska could promote films being produced and made in Nebraska. It is not a bad market to get into. One point seven billion dollars of business is filmed outside California and that market, that \$1 7 billion market is the one that Nebraska
