

there. That is why the bill was introduced. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Abboud. Discussion? Seeing none, all in favor then of the bill to be advanced to E & R please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 33 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 296, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. LB 216.

CLERK: Mr. President, 216 was a bill introduced by Senator Ashford. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 13 of this year, referred to the Transportation Committee for hearing, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes Senator Brad Ashford.

SENATOR ASHFORD: Mr. President and members, this bill was brought to me by the State Patrol and is simply an effort to make more clear the definition of what signal lights are in 39-653 of the existing law. It is an effort and in this case what we are doing is defining signal lights as brake and turn signal lights. It is simply a clean-up matter, a definitional matter that the State Patrol felt was necessary in their enforcement procedure. So I would move the advancement of this bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the motion to advance LB 216. Any discussion? If not, all in favor of the motion vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President. on the motion to advance 216.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 216 is advanced. Announcements, messages?
