SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any other discussion on the bill? Seeing none, all in favor of advancing LB 353 please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LE 353 is advanced. LB 483, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 483 was a bill introduced by Senator Wehrbein. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 22. It was referred to the Urban Affairs Committee for public hearing. It was advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair is pleased to recognize the gentleman from the 2nd District, Senator Roger Wehrbein.

SENATOR WEHRBEIN: Thank you, Mr. President and members of the Legislature. This bill was brought on behalf of Nebraska City, but it also affects all first class cities and villages and towns in Nebraska in that it reduces the number of copies needed to be on file, as far as their codes are concerned, it reduces it from 3 to 1. It is an effort to clarify within the regulations how many they have to have on file, and reduces it from 3 to 1, and brings it more in line as Lincoln and Omaha already have this. I would urge adoption of this bill. I'd answer any questions on it.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You've heard the motion. Is there discussion on the motion to advance the bill by Senator Wehrbein? Seeing none, the question is, shall LB 483 be advanced to E & R Initial. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.
