That may seem not to have much to do with what we are talking about here this morning, but, remember, people who wind up feeling desperate did not have that feeling from the beginning. Had there been somebody, some agency that they had been shown, through its conduct, had an interest in them and their problems, they perhaps could have been shown a different way and perhaps not. But every avenue that we can contrive, as lawmakers, that might prevent these things from happening, we have an obligation to do that. Not one person has stood on this floor and said that there are not seriously troubled people in this state, in the cities and in the countryside. Then we talk about \$100,000 that could alleviate or address this very serious problem and we don't want to do it. We are talking about a budget and we should, but there comes a time when we have to establish priorities and sometimes we can become pennywise and pound foolish. I think this would be one of the best...

SPEAKER BARRETT: One minute.

SENATOR CHAMBERS: ...expenditures of \$100,000 that this Legislature can make this session. What will not occur through the senators on this floor is a trek out to the countryside should there develop a lot of problems of the kind that the Stangals are enmeshed in now. But I am willing to go because when you see what people are involved in, they need to see public officials. They need to see our deeds and not just hear our words. This is but a start. And I hope that maybe we can keep some people from reaching that point of desperation where they will do those kind of things that convert them from an economic tragedy into a law enforcement problem and perhaps a law enforcement killing. These problems are brought to me and I am tired of having to deal with them. So, in a sense, what I am speaking for this morning is coming from selfishness.
