CLERK: Mr. President, the first item on 389 are E & R amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 389 be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments to LB 389. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. The ayes have it, carried, they are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Wesely would move to amend the bill. (Wesely amendment appears on page 626 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wesely, please.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, LB 389 as you may recall deals with the Home Health Services that the Department of Health is providing and would continue under the bill. It is a status quo bill, but there was some language, the revisor's statutes came down and suggested we make, to the bill that they felt ought to be in an amendment form. Evidently some terminology was wrong in the bill. Home Health Services should be Home Health Agencies and profit should be made more clear, for profit is added. So it is really technical and not very important but those are the changes we were requested to make in the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Wesely. Senator Higgins, on the amendment, please.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Mr. President, I'd just like to ask Senator Wesely one question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wesely, will you yield for a question?

SENATOR WESELY: Sure.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Senator, I assume that this amendment in no way takes out individual nurses that might contract with government agencies.
