

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 387 pass? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: (Record vote read. See pages 659-60 of the Legislative Journal.) 29 ayes, 14 nays, 3 present and not voting, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 387 passes. That concludes Final Reading. Thank you again for your cooperation. The call is raised. Anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, yes, there is, excuse me. Senator Pappas would like to withdraw LB 282. That will be laid over.

I have amendments to be printed from Senator Landis to LB 71. Signed by Senator Landis. That is all that I have, Mr. President.

CLERK: Mr. President, 639 by Senator Rupp, on page 639 of the Journal.
