SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Lorraine Langford, please.

SENATOR LANGFORD: Elm Creek actually was founded in 1887. That is when it was incorporated. However, the village had been there for 20 years already. January is their actual centennial date. However, they are celebrating in July this year. The village is one of those along the Platte, which is not deteriorating. As of last year, they have a new medical building and new doctors in their town. So they are an up-and-coming, young village that is a hundred years old.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Langford. Any discussion on the proposed resolution? Seeing none, all in favor of LR 36, proposed by Senator Langford, vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted on the resolution proposed by Senator Langford? Have you all voted? Record, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of LR 36.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LR 36 is adopted. Moving to General File, item 6 on the agenda. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, if I might right before that, two items. Senator Pappas has amendments to be printed to LB 148 and 613. (See pages 784-75 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, LB 449 was a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21st. It was referred to the Appropriations Committee for hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending by the Appropriations Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The Chair recognizes the distinguished gentleman from the 25th legislative district, Jerome Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, LB 449 is a deficit bill which was moved separately from additional deficits that will be proposed later on in the session, but these were deficits which needed to be attended to earlier. The committee amendment does three things. First, it adds funds of 276,000 for the Attorney General's Office and that is relative to the lawsuit that Nebraska is engaged in, or will be engaged in, with the State of Wyoming over water rights from the Platte.
