

SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I ask for a roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: A roll call vote has been requested. All members please return to your seats. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on page 800 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 27 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion to return fails. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read LB 304 on Final Reading.)
