SENATOR SCHMIT: Mr. President, I move the advancement of the bill. As I indicated earlier in the conversation with Senator Scofield, I do believe that it is a reasonable amount of money. I believe the Water Management Board which was created by this Legislature has a responsibility to pursue this study. I would hope they could do so for that amount of money. If they can't, I would hope to hear from them prior to the time the bill becomes law at which time you might be able to reconsider your vote. I'd also suggest, as I said earlier, that in the event more funds are needed, next January we can come back and appropriate additional funds for the completion of the study. But I believe at this time that this amount of money ought to be substantial and ought to be sufficient for the conduct of the study and I move for the advancement of the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Schmit, there are no further lights. We will be voting on the advancement of LB 146A. All in favor say aye...I'm sorry, vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Mr. Clerk, record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Madam President, on the motion to advance the bill.

SENATOR LABEDZ: LB 146A is advanced. Are there any messages or reports?

CLERK: Madam President, Health and Human Services would report 173 as indefinitely postponed. That is signed by Senator Wesely. Government Committee, whose Chair is Senator Rupp, reports 198 to General File with amendments; 211 to General File with amendments; 362 General File with amendments and 476 General File with amendments. Those are all signed by Senator Rupp as Chair. (See pages 868-69 of the Legislative Journal.)

Last item, Madam President, a request from Senator Ashford to add his name to 475 and Senator Chizek to 223. (See page 869 of the Journal.)

SENATOR LABEDZ: No objections, so ordered.

CLERK: That is all that I have, Madam President.

SENATOR MILLER: Madam President, I move that this body adjourn until March 3 at nine o'clock in the morning.
