SENATOR WITHEM: Right.

SENATOR BAACK: This is petroleum.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay. The second question. Does it have anything at all to do with overweight beet trucks?

SENATOR BAACK: No, it doesn't have anything to do with overweight beet trucks.

SENATOR WITHEM: Okay, in that case, I will support the bill.

SENATOR BAACK: Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Owen Elmer.

SENATOR ELMER: Thank you, Mr. President. Hitchcock, Red Willow County areas are very large oil producing areas and a bit aware of this problem and it would solve some paper work and some licensing problems for the very large, heavy, well servicing equipment that the oil drilling people use and I would strongly support the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any other discussion? If not, the question is, shall LB 411 be advanced to E & R Initial? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the advancement of the bill? Have you all voted? Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance LB 411, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. I would like to pass over at this time LB 290 and proceed to LB 469. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 469 was a bill that was introduced by the Business and Labor Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21, referred to the Business and Labor Committee, advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments pending, Mr. President, by the Business and Labor Committee.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The Chair recognizes the Chairman of the Business and Labor Committee, Senator Tim Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Mr. President and members, the committee
