CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 543 is advanced. Roll over 123 to 459. I'm sorry. An A bill. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 543A, offered by Senator Wesely. (Read title.) The bill was referred directly to General File. I have no amendments to the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Wesely.

SENATOR WESELY: Thank you. Mr. Speaker, members, LB 543A deals with the appropriation for this. Again, this is all cash funded, paid for out of the fees paid by cosmetologists. I'd ask for advancement of the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion? If not, those in favor of the advancement of the bill vote aye, opposed nay. We are voting on the advancement of the A bill. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of the A bill

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 543A is advanced. LB 459, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 459 was a bill introduced by the Health and Human Services Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21, referred to the Health Committee for hearing, advanced to General File. It is our attempt, after working with the Health Department and the Nursing Home Association and hospitals, a number of changes were needed in our ICF licensure laws.
