SENATOR HANIBAL: Only to say that, Mr. President, that I am very willing to sit down and talk with Senator Chambers, and very open to any discussion he might offer me, and if he can show me the error of my ways or my misinformation, I will be only too pleased to come back in and amend or do something different to this bill on Select File, and move for its advancement.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: LB 258 advances. Mr. Clerk, do you have something to put in at this time?

CLERK: Yes, sir, I do. Thank you, Mr. President. A new A bill, 376A by Senator Hall. (Read for the first time by title. See page 934 of the Legislative Journal.)

I have a report of registered lobbyists for the week of February 27 through March 5. Senator Landis has amendments to be printed, Mr. President, to LB 71.

Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review respectfully reports we have carefully examined engrossed LB 404 and find the same correctly engrossed. Education Committee reports 182 to General File with amendments, 283 General File with amendments, 417, 529, 538, all to General File with amendments, all signed by Senator Withem as Chair. Banking Committee reports 213 to General File, 576 General File, 577 General File, 319 General File with amendments, 514 General File with amendments, 615 General File with amendments, 214 indefinitely postponed, all signed by Senator Remmers as Chair. The Health Committee reports 249 to General File with amendments, signed Senator Wesely. Judiciary reports 571 to General File, 759 indefinitely postponed, signed by Senator Chizek. Government Committee reports 55 to General File with amendments, 588 General File with amendments, 666 General File with amendments. Those are signed by Senator Rupp. (See pages 935-45 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have, Mr. President.
