PRESIDENT: LB 148 passes. Do you have anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, I do. Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 683 to Select File, 21CA to Select File, and 258 to Select File, all of those having E & R amendments attached, Mr. President. Natural Resources Committee reports 401 indefinitely postponed, 613, 692, 704 all indefinitely postponed, all signed by Senator Schmit as Chair. Enrollment and Review reports 459 correctly Engrossed, 459A and 469 correctly Engrossed, those signed by Senator Moore. That is all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 967-69 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: May I introduce some guests of Senator Pappas under the south balcony, we have Sheriff Deterding and his wife, Susie, I assume of North Platte. Would you please rise. Thank you for visiting us today. Senator Coordsen also has some guests, Blaine Huss of Fairbury, Nebraska, under the south balcony. Would you please rise. We'll move on to Select File, please. LB 71, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item I have are Enrollment and Review amendments, Senator Moore.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments to LB 71 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Landis would move to amend the bill. Senator Landis's amendment is on page 935 of the Journal.

PRESIDENT: Senator Landis, please.

SENATOR LANDIS: Mr. Speaker, members of the Legislature, this is the first of two clarifying amendments. I'll be handling the first. Senator Ashford will be handling the second. They were promised to you on General File. They've been printed in the Journal for your observation. They accomplish several things. Number one, they define when the arbitration act can be used.
