LB 292, 347

SPEAKER BARRETT: The amendment is adopted.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, I move that LB 292 be advanced and ask for a machine vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the motion to advance LB 292 with a machine vote. All in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the advancement of LB 292 to E & R for Engrossing? Please record.

CLERK: 29 ayes, 2 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of LB 292.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 292 is advanced. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, 347 is the next item. The first order of business are Enrollment and Review amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 347 be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: You have heard the motion to adopt the E & R amendments. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. Carried. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pappas would move to amend the bill. (The Pappas amendment appears on pages 1000-03 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: The member from North Platte, Senator Pappas.

SENATOR PAPPAS: Mr. Speaker, fellow colleagues, as Senator Vard Johnson has often said that maybe you should listen carefully to this amendment because it is just a little bit more than a technical amendment. Basically, what this amendment will do, it will allow local school districts the option of paying expenses in lieu of providing bus service. And it gives more local control back to the local school districts. Are there any lights on? No, I'm not.
