A very special guest of Senator Lowell Johnson, Mary Lou Echtenkamp of Fremont and a foreign exchange student, Vera Vita Antunes from Sao Paul, Brazil, from the village of Assis. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and I do sign, LR 48, engrossed LB 411, engrossed LB 469 and engrossed LB 565. Next bill, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 324, Mr. President, offered by Senator Schmit. (Title read.) The bill was introduced on January 15, referred to Urban Affairs, advanced to General File. I have committee amendments pending by the Urban Affairs Committee, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Paul Hartnett, for the committee amendments.

SENATOR HARTNETT: Mr. Speaker and members of the body, simply that there are two committee amendments. One simply defines what an alternate director is, is the first amendment. The second amendment, if they hold meetings outside the State of Nebraska they have to be held in the cities that have part of the power. Take for example, if the City of Greeley, Colorado, is one of the cities, they have to meet in Greeley, Colorado. They can't meet at Aspen or some other place. So it simply limits where they meet outside with this. So, I urge the body to adopt the amendments.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion on the committee amendments as offered by Senator Hartnett? If not, those in favor of the committee amendments please vote aye, opposed nay. On the committee amendments. Please vote if you care to vote. Please record, Mr. Clerk.
