PRESIDENT: LB 774 is advanced. May I introduce some guests, please, in the north balcony. They are guests of all of you members of the Legislature. We have 100 members or more of the Nebraska Farm Bureau and they are from all over the state. Roberta Chadwick is their leader. Would you folks please stand and be recognized by your Legislature. Thank you for visiting us today. We will move on to Select File, and I understand 101 and 101A is going to be passed over today. Move on to LB 572, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first item on 572 are E & R amendments, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. President, I move the E & R amendments to LB 572 be adopted.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, I now have an amendment from Senator Warner to the bill. (Warner amendment appears on pages 1208-10 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, this amendment deals with the distribution of session laws and statutes. The issue came up during the course of the Appropriation hearing and it turned out that the current statute required a great deal more copies printed than were ever requested or used. It was a small saving, but not insignificant saving, seems to me it was \$7,000 or \$8,000 that could be saved by reducing the statutory numbers that had been required, the number of volumes that different entities could receive back to what, in fact, they traditionally request. And I could read out all the numbers, but to my knowledge everyone who is involved in the distribution of these agrees that the numbers included here are adequate to fulfill all of the requests that ever occur and I think the testimony, as I understand, to why this amendment is needed is a pile of undistributed books down in the basement. So, I move its adoption.
