PRESIDENT: Very good. We will take the first four then, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Well, Mr. President, LR 59 by Senator Rod Johnson is a resolution honoring the Clay Center High School boys' basketball team. LR 60 by Senator Johnson is honoring the Aurora High School boys' basketball team. LR 61 by Senator Rod Johnson honors the Sutton High School boys' basketball team. And 62 by Senator Rod Johnson honors the Hampton High School boys' basketball team.

PRESIDENT: Senator Rod Johnson, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members, very briefly, all four of these programs were teams that made it to the state basketball tournament. One was a champion, the Aurora Huskies ball club, and two of the programs finished second, losing in the finals, and the third, Clay Center, lost on opening night, but was a state ranked ball club most of the year. So all finished in the top 10 in their respective divisions in B, C1, C2 and D1, so we simply ask that you honor their programs.

PRESIDENT: What we will do here, ladies and gentlemen, is suspend the rules and vote on all four of them at one time. So all those in favor of suspending the rules and voting all at one time please vote aye, opposed nay. Pat, this is just...that's right, we need 30 votes. Please vote. You are voting on the...record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, 31 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to suspend the rules and adopt LR 59, 60, 61 and 62.

PRESIDENT: LR 59, 60, 61, and 62 are adopted. We will move on to LR 64, please.

CLERK: Mr. President, LR 64 is found on page 1184 of the Journal. And, Mr. President, I have an amendment to the resolution offered by Senator Rod Johnson.

PRESIDENT: All right, Senator Rod Johnson, please.

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Mr. President and members, this resolution deals with the community of Palmer, Nebraska which is
