Mr. President, Urban Affairs Committee reports 369 to General File with amendments attached. (See pages 1322-23 of the Legislative Journal.) That is all that I have.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. I would like to proceed then into Item 8 on the agenda, Select File, work Select File and, time permitting, I would like to proceed to LB 42A which needs to catch up with LB 42, and then, time permitting, one or two additional priority bills, Senator Rupp's 453 and LB 198. Select File, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first bill on consideration is 367 and the first item are E & R amendments, Senator.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Moore, please.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Speaker, I move the E & R amendments to LB 367 be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion is to adopt the E & R amendments to 367. All in favor say aye. Opposed no. The ayes have it. Carried. They are adopted.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Baack would move to amend the bill. (The Baack amendment appears on page 1324 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Baack, please.

SENATOR BAACK: Yes. Mr. Speaker and members, Pat, could you read that amendment to me? I put in several amendments this morning. I don't know what this one did.

CLERK: Operative date of August 1, '87, Senator, and it has the emergency clause to make it take effect.

SENATOR BAACK: Okay. Okay, thank you, Pat. What this does is it adds the emergency clause to this bill. This is the bill that I referred to earlier when I was talking about LB 413, which is a recodification of the special ed laws and also puts into our statutes the federal definitions of handicapping conditions. The reason that we need the E clause on this and we need an August 1st effective date is so that the department can
