SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you, Senator Landis. You have requested a call of the house. Those in favor of the house going under call please vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Members, please return to your seats and record your presence. Senator Scofield, record your presence. Senator Harris. Senators Chambers and Lynch, please report to the Chamber. Senators Lynch and Chambers, the house is under call. Machine vote, Senator Landis? The question is, shall LB 88 be raised from the Judiciary Committee? Twenty-five votes required. All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Have you all voted if you care to vote? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to raise the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion prevails, the bill is raised. Anything for the record?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do. Attorney General's Opinion addressed to Senator Morehead regarding LB 708. Your Enrolling Clerk has presented to the Governor bills read on Final Reading this morning. (Re: LB 549, 559, 591, 712, 440.) New A bills, 598A by Senator Lynch appropriates funds for 598; 603A by Senator Chizek appropriates funds for 603; 312A by Senator Warner appropriates funds for 312; 726A by Senator Vard Johnson appropriates funds for 726.
