some concern about that so we do request some General Funds to cover the cost of the act, and that is what the A bill does. The General Fund requirement is \$20,000, \$20,535. So I would move its advancement.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Discussion? If not, the question is, shall LB 226A be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please record.

CLERK: 27 ayes, 0 nays on the motion to advance 226A, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The bill is advanced. LB 603A.

CLERK: Mr. President, 603A by Senator Chizek appropriates funds for LB 603. The bill was introduced on March 31 of this year.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Chizek, please.

SENATOR CHIZEK: Mr. President and members of the body, the amendment is on page 1407 of the Journal, and I would tell you there is another amendment pending on LB 603 which would strike the emergency clause. We now have it straightened out. I know we are on the A bill, but I wanted to address an amendment that would affect the A bill as we go on here. The amendment that will be pending on the bill, itself, would strike the emergency clause and phase in the replacement of the two part-time Parole Board members instead of terminating their part-time status on June 30th of 1987. Therefore, the fiscal impact of LB 603 will be less than anticipated in this A bill. However, at this time I would ask the body to advance this to Select File where we are preparing an appropriate amendment reducing the appropriations amount indicated in 603 which we will offer then. Let me give you an example that in Fiscal Year 1988, the amount will be reduced from \$34,470 to 16,312, and in Fiscal Year '89, the amount will be reduced from \$34,149 if this amendment to 603 is adopted, and I would ask for the adoption.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion on the advancement of the bill? If not, the question is, shall LB 603A be advanced? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 603A.
