

I suppose, a monthly fee in that regard. Many folks have chosen not to buy the descramblers, not to subscribe to the various channels, primarily because it is expensive, and I think most people feel that they have invested a great deal of money in purchasing a satellite dish and its receiver, and simply don't wish to contract, so to speak, for those programs. You have got to remember that in most satellite dishes, you receive a lot more than just the premium channels. You receive, quite frankly, hundreds of channels, everything from Spanish speaking channels to worldwide channels, and so a lot of folks have not complained as much as I thought they would simply because they have stopped watching particular programs because of the scrambling, and have been checking out other channels on their satellite dish receivers. So, all I am saying is if there is a cheaper way of doing it, I guess I am surprised that the private sector hasn't found a way to address it, but if the rural public power people can do it, more power to them, and I don't know if this bill is going to actually bring about that panacea that folks see in it, but, quite frankly, there are still problems there that have not yet been addressed, and I think are not going to be as easy to solve as this bill claims it is going to be, and I assume there are going to be customers in the rural areas that simply will not be interested in any descrambling type packages, and, let's face it, there are also the black market descramblers that are out there that folks are buying or trying to buy that may be the cheapest way to go. So, there are a lot of alternatives other than 345, but like I said, if Howard can prove to this body that he and the rural public power people can provide a service to the public, the rural customers, particularly, that there is a cheaper way to do it than what is being provided now, then, great. That is fantastic. I am sure that my Dad, my brothers and others, will be right there to subscribe but,...
