**SPEAKER BARRETT:** One minute.

**SENATOR CHAMBERS:** ...as a state where we were prior to Initiative 300. I did not participate in that effort, but if this bill succeeds and any group wants to start another drive to clutter up the Constitution some more, because that is what it will take, to nullify what the Legislature is trying to do through its nullification, then I will actively participate in that effort. And I would even go so far as to encourage people in all the talks that I give around the state from now on to watch the progress of this bill, and should it be enacted and should the Governor sign it, Judge Weihing, then I'm going to tell them we have to come forth with all guns blazing, figuratively speaking, but I'm opposed to 337 and 337A.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** Any other discussion on the A bill? Seeing none, the question is then, shall LB 337A advance? Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Please vote. Have you all voted? Have you all voted if you care to vote? Record, please.

**CLERK:** 25 ayes, 6 nays, Mr. President, on advancement of the A bill.

**SPEAKER BARRETT:** LB 337A is advanced. Anything for the record, Mr. Clerk?

**CLERK:** Mr. President, I have an Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Chizek.

Mr. President, amendments to be printed by Senator Remmers to 453 and to 615.

New A bill by Senator Rod Johnson and Moore, 561A, appropriates funds for 561.

Health Committee reports 542 to General File with amendments; 736 General File with amendments. Those are signed by the respective Chairs.

Mr. President, Your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 78, 329 correctly engrossed. That is all that I have, Mr. President. (See pages 1457-65 of the Legislative Journal.)
