PRESIDENT: Thank you. The question is the advancement of the bill. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Was your question, how many are excused? Two.

SENATOR HABERMAN: I'll ask for a call of the house and a roll call vote.

PRESIDENT: Okay, the question is, shall the house go under call? All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: 22 ayes, 1 nay to go under call.

PRESIDENT: The house is under call. Please record your presence, those that are here. Those that are not here please return to the Chamber and record your presence. I'd ask you to please look up to see if your light is illuminated and, if not, push the green button, please. The two that are excused are Senator Abboud and Senator Labeledz. We are looking for Senator Higgins, Senator Goodrich, Senator McFarland, Senator Withem. We are looking for Senator McFarland. There is Senator McFarland now and all are present except those two that are excused and the question is the advancement of LB 185 and a roll call vote has been asked for. Would you please be in your seats so that we can begin and hold it down so the Clerk can hear your response.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 1517-18 of the Legislative Journal.) 26 ayes, 21 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of the bill.

PRESIDENT: The bill is advanced. How about the A bill, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Mr. President, on the A bill I have no amendments to the bill.

PRESIDENT: Senator Hall. Oh, Senator Moore, you are here. We are on Select File and...

CLERK: LB 185A advance, Senator.

SENATOR MILLER: I move for the advancement of 185A.

PRESIDENT: You've heard the motion. All in favor say aye.
