

the cash that is needed to pay that property tax is not going to be there. And people's property can be taken from them if they don't pay the taxes on them. As far as the power of business to make people bend the knee, I saw something Sunday that shocked me that NETV did. On occasion, they have called me at the last minute to appear on some program because they had to have somebody there and on occasion I have agreed because I thought that that's the way they operated. But when I can see them cart their equipment to Omaha to accommodate the man who runs ConAgra sit in his office and he can actually look at them and tell them, hurry up, boys, hurry up. First of all, it's degrading to call a grown man a boy. But that's what business can do. So, ETV, if they are going to get me on any of their programs, will have to come to my office. So that means I won't be doing any more interviews on ETV. But that shows how business can get everybody to bend the knee and if people in a small town are about to lose that town and a few people in office can persuade them to vote in favor of a proposition, the people will vote for it. And I think that in the same way that people who serve as a director of the insurance department down here wind up working for the insurance industry and while they are serving as director they make decisions to feather their bed and provide a safe and smooth transition from director of the insurance department into a job in the industry. There are politicians who would trick their people into voting for propositions that would give money to certain interests, knowing that when they get out of office they are going to take a job with that interest. And these things are not out of the question. They happen at the federal level because the federal government does have people who can engineer the granting of large contracts to large multinational industries. The final point that I would make, Senator Schmit mentioned the Ak-Sar-Ben bill that will benefit an Omaha interest. He is right. That atrocious 773 is coming and he is right. But, as I look at those bills, and they are going to take revenue, my 757...let me make sure I've got the number right, 757 which would raise some revenue begins to look better and better. Senator Schmit, you have taken the frost off the pumpkin on Ak-Sar-Ben but you have added it, if that's a good thing to have, on 757.
