SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. The question is, shall LB 757 be indefinitely postponed? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. A simple majority, have you all voted? Senator Abboud.

SENATOR ABBOUD: Mr. President, I would request a call of the house, roll call vote.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question is, shall the house go under call? All in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 21 ayes, 0 nays to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Record your presence, please. Members outside the Chamber, please return to the Chamber. The house is under call. Senator Baack, Senator Korshoj, Senator Labeledz, Senator Remmers, the house is under call. Senator Wesely, Senator McFarland, we are under call. While we're waiting, Senator Ashford has some guests in the north balcony. They are 18 fourth graders and their teacher from Brownell-Talbot in Omaha. Would you please stand and be recognized. We appreciate your visiting with us today. Senator Schellpeper, the house is under call. Senator Schellpeper is apparently on his way. May we proceed with the roll call? Thank you. Proceed with the roll call, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Roll call vote taken as found on pages 1560-61 of the Legislative Journal.) 20 ayes, 23 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to indefinitely postpone.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion fails. Anything for the record, Mr. Clerk? The call is raised.
