

We will start the roll call.

CLERK: (Commenced reading the roll call vote.)

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Higgins.

SENATOR HIGGINS: Madam President, I thought Senator Schmit asked for a reverse order, or did I misunderstand the Senator?

SENATOR LABEDZ: I was not sitting in the Chair at the time. Senator Schmit, did you ask for a reverse order? He did ask for it, Senator Higgins, but he said it was okay to continue the call. Proceed.

CLERK: (Continued with roll call vote as found on page 1643 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 19 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SENATOR LABEDZ: The amendment fails. Do we have any other amendments, Mr. Clerk?

CLERK: Madam President, Senator Schmit would move to amend. Senator Schmit would like to withdraw that amendment. I have nothing further on the bill, Madam President.

SENATOR LABEDZ: We are now on the bill. Raise the call. Senator Johnson, would you like to speak on the bill?

SENATOR R. JOHNSON: Madam President, I believe, at this time, I will just reserve my comments to closing.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Senator Schmit, your light is still on, would you like to discuss the bill?

SENATOR SCHMIT: Well, I would like to discuss the previous vote just a little. I would suggest, you know, that we would have had more success getting that appropriation, at least we might have got Senator Wesely and Landis's and Marsh's vote and some of the rest of them if we would have said we are going to call it a playpen of indoor practice fields and build a roof over those farms. It makes about as much sense, you know, as some of the other things we do around here. I well recall speaking to former Governor Kerrey about a gentleman who was active in reclamation work and wanted to build a new building. Couldn't get the money appropriated to build a new building so he called it a dam and he got the money for it and the Congress never
