LB 430, 777

Senator Rupp, please. While we are waiting, I am pleased to announce that Senator Nelson has 35 fourth graders visiting in the north balcony. They are from Shoemaker Elementary in Grand Island. They are accompanied by their teacher. Would you people please stand and be recognized by the Legislature. We're glad to have you visiting with us this morning. Roll call has been requested. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read roll call vote as found on page 1879 of the Legislative Journal.) 21 ayes, 25 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to return.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion fails. Anything further on the bill?

CLERK: Nothing further, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Care to read the bill?

CLERK: (Read LB 430 on Final Reading.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: All provisions of law relative to procedure having been complied with, the question is, shall LB 430 with the emergency clause attached become law? Those in favor please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 1880 of the Legislative Journal.) 43 ayes, 3 nays, 3 excused and not voting, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 430E passes. Next bill.

CLERK: Mr. President, I have a motion on the desk. Senator Haberman would move to return LB 777 to Select File for a specific amendment. (Haberman amendment appears on page 1880 of the Legislative Journal.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Haberman, please.

SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, my specific amendment is to indefinitely postpone the bill. Before I go any further, I wonder if Senator Hall, who is the Chairman of the committee, would answer a few questions?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Hall.
