have you people with us this morning. While the Legislature is in session and capable of transacting business, I propose to sign and I do sign reengrossed LB 453, LB 324, LB 504, LB 116, reengrossed LB 430, Engrossed LB 777. Moving to General File, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the first bill for consideration this morning is 104A. The bill was introduced by Senator Dierks. It's the companion bill for LB 104 and it appropriates funds to implement the provisions thereof. The bill was introduced on April 21, Mr. President, referred directly to General File.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The gentleman from Ewing, Senator Dierks.

SENATOR DIERKS: Thank you, Mr. Speaker. Members of the Legislature, I would just like to urge you to advance this bill to bring it up with the original bill. Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any discussion? Any discussion on the advancement of 104A? Senator Hall, please.

SENATOR HALL: Would Senator Dierks yield to a question?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Dierks, please.

SENATOR DIERKS: Certainly.

SENATOR HALL: How much is the A bill?

SENATOR DIERKS: The A bill is \$4,000.

SENATOR HALL: Thank you.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any other discussion? If not, all in favor of advancing the bill please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 31 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on the advancement of 104A.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 104A is advanced. LB 283.

CLERK: Mr. President, 283 was a bill introduced by Senators Withem and Chizek. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 14, referred to Education, advanced to General File. There are committee amendments pending. I, however
