LB 104A is reported to Select File, Mr. President, signed by Senator Moore. (See page 1895 of the Journal.)

I have an explanation of vote from Senator Smith.

And I have a new resolution, LR 98, from Senator Chambers, regarding...asking the Legislature to reaffirm the principle of equal treatment and dignity for all school children. That will be laid over, Mr. President. (See pages 1890-91 of the Legislative Journal.) And that is all that I have.

PRESIDENT: I wish to recall your attention to the fact that the Speaker sent out a little notice saying that Dr. Palmer's last morning will be tomorrow morning for the invocation. Those of you who wish to see him or visit him upon leaving, wish him bon voyage, please be here about nine o'clock in the morning. Mr. Speaker, is it your desire to close up shop? All right. Senator Abboud, do you wish to do the honors?
