SENATOR LANDIS: ...forged out of self-interest and compassion and hard work and vision and courage. You forge the real world and this is the time to do it for higher education. I urge your vote for this amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. You have heard the closing offered by Senator Landis and the question is the adoption of the Landis amendment to LB 780.

SENATOR LANDIS: Bill, how about a call of the house so we can get everybody here? We know we are going to need it anyway, don't we?

SPEAKER BARRETT: Call of the house has been requested. Those in favor of the house going under call, please vote aye, opposed nay. Record.

CLERK: 18 ayes, 1 nay to go under call, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The house is under call. Members, please record your presence. Those outside the Legislative Chamber, please return to the Chamber. Unauthorized personnel, please leave the floor. Members, please check in. Senator Harris, Senator Hartnett. Senator Chambers, please. Senator Baack, Senator Lamb. Senator Rod Johnson, the house is under call. Senator Lynch, please report to the Chamber. Senator Scofield, please check in. There are six members excused.

SENATOR LANDIS: That's enough.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Landis, did you request a roll call vote? Thank you. Machine vote. Those in favor of the Landis amendment, please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Senator Chambers. Roll call vote has been requested. Proceed, Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: (Read the roll call vote. See pages 1955-56 of the Legislative Journal.) 15 ayes, 24 nays, Mr. President, on adoption of the amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The motion is defeated. Senator Landis.

SENATOR LANDIS: Just a point of personal privilege, Mr. Speaker, if I could.
