LB 270A, 270, 780, 782, 784

SPEAKER BARRETT: If there are no objections, it is withdrawn, yes. Next item.

CLERK: I have nothing further on the bill, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Back to the bill, Senator Warner. Waives closing. The question is, then, the advancement of LB 780 to E & R Initial. Those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted on the advancement of the bill? Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 35 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 780.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 780 is advanced. Anything for the record?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do. Mr. President, Senator Hall has amendments to be printed to 784. A new A bill, Mr. President, 270A by Senator Chizek. (Read for the first time by title. See page 1990 of the Legislative Journal.)

Mr. President, there will be a meeting of the Executive Board on Wednesday morning at 8:45 in Room 2102, Exec Board, Wednesday morning. And, Mr. President, Senator Abboud would like to add his name to 270 as co-introducer. And that is all that I have.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Moving then to 782, Mr. Clerk,

CLERK: Mr. President, 782 was a bill introduced by the Appropriations Committee and signed by its members. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on April 24, referred directly to General File, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Appropriations Chairman Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I would move that LB 782 be advanced. LB 782 is the appropriation bill with the accompanying A bill for the distribution of those funds back to agencies. I would just point out that the language of 782 is the salary policy. In the A bill are, of course, the funds. The salary policy that is recommended in the bill is a 3 percent, in essence, across-the-board increase including the increasing of the minimum-maximums in the different pay classifications, and this would be true of those employees under the State Personnel System. In the case of higher education, the 3 percent is appropriated to each of the university and
