LB 783A, 784

Mr. Clerk.

ASSISTANT CLERK: LB 783A was introduced by the Appropriations Committee. (Read title.) The bill was on General File. I have no amendments pending, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the A bill be advanced. As I indicated earlier, there is no increase in the appropriation for '87-88, and a 764,000 General Fund increase for '88-89, and a total increase for '88-89 of about a million, three when counting cash, federal and revolving funds. I move that the bill be advanced.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Any discussion? Any questions? Seeing none, those in favor of the advancement of the A bill, please vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Please record.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the advancement of 783A.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The appropriations bill is advanced. Before proceeding to LB 784, I am pleased to announce that Senator Warner has some guests who are visiting the Legislature in the north balcony. We have 40 students, eighth grade students from Raymond Central with their teacher. Would you please stand and be recognized. Thank you. We are glad to have you with us this morning. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: LB 784, Mr. President, offered by the Appropriations Committee. The bill was introduced on April 24, referred directly to General File. (Read title.)

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, members of the Legislature, I move that LB 784 be advanced. LB 784 contains appropriation of 20 different items. You will recall from the committee's viewpoint these items are as important as those in the mainline but, nevertheless, in order to provide a little more flexibility for floor discussion, these items were put into a separate bill and it is about 4.6 million in the '87-88 appropriations, and about 4.2 million in the '88-89. The items that are included in this bill, I will just touch on them quickly. In the case of
