CLERK: 30 ayes, 1 nay on the advancement of LB 218, Mr. President.

SPEAKER BARRETT: LB 218 is advanced. Anything for the record?

CLERK: One item, Mr. President. New resolution, LR 109 by Senators Rod Johnson and a number of the members. (Read explanation of LR 109 as found on pages 2020-22 of the Legislative Journal.) That will be laid over, Mr. President. That's all that I have.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Moving to LB 768.

CLERK: Mr. President, 768 introduced by the Speaker at the request of the Governor. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on February 2, referred to Appropriations, advanced to General File. I have no amendments to the bill.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Warner, please.

SENATOR WARNER: Mr. President, I move the bill be advanced. As indicated by the Clerk in reading the title, this is the salaries appropriation for members of the Legislature required by the Constitution to be in a separate bill. And I would move its advancement. Total dollars, \$252,840.
