

all the above. I'll return the bill back to General File so it can be debated further. But the one thing I ask, this bill will help prevent a growing problem across the State of Nebraska. And everybody has these people and these types of doings in their particular district. It is not opening up a new section of law, it is not increasing gambling, in fact it is probably putting more of a control on it than we've ever had before because it wasn't enforced before but now it is starting to be. All I ask is to suspend the rules, adopt and we'll return it back to General File and we'll go from there.

PRESIDENT: The question is the suspension of the rules. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted that care to? Record vote has been asked for. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: (Read record vote as found on page 2028 of the Legislative Journal.) 11 ayes, 18 nays. Mr. President, on the motion to suspend the rules.

PRESIDENT: The motion fails. You have anything else, Mr. Clerk, to put in at this time?

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, I do.

PRESIDENT: Okay.

CLERK: Mr. President, your Committee on Enrollment and Review reports LB 114 as correctly Engrossed, and 736 as correctly Engrossed, Mr. President. I have an Attorney General's Opinion to Senator Hannibal (Re. LB 258), and Senator Vard Johnson would like to print amendments to LB 773. That is all that I have. (See pages 2029-32 of the Legislative Journal.)

PRESIDENT: Move on to LB 124. Mr. Clerk, where do we stand on that one?

CLERK: Mr. President, 124 is on Select File. The bill has been discussed. E & R amendments were adopted on April 21, Mr. President. There were other amendments offered at that time, none of which were adopted. I do have a priority motion, Mr. President, from Senator Lamb. Senator Lamb would move to bracket the bill until January 10 of 1987.

PRESIDENT: All right. Senator Lamb, please.
