PRESIDENT: Thank you. Mr. Clerk, we have a motion on the desk?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Pappas would move to indefinitely postpone the bill. Now the introducer has the option to lay it over.

SENATOR WESELY: Pass over it.

PRESIDENT: Pass over it. All right, it is passed over. Go on to LB 474. Did you want to talk about it, Senator Pappas? Okay. Mr. Clerk, we have 474.

CLERK: Yes, Mr. President, 474 is a bill introduced by Senator Vard Johnson. (Read title.) The bill was introduced on January 21, referred to the Business and Labor Committee for public hearing. The bill was advanced to General File. I do have committee amendments by the Business and Labor Committee.

PRESIDENT: Senator Vard Johnson.

SENATOR V. JOHNSON: I think Senator Labeledz is going to run the Business and Labor amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Labeledz, please.

SENATOR LABEDZ: Thank you, Mr. President. Senator Hall is not present so I will do my best to take care of the committee amendments. On page 2 of LB 474, on line 15, it shows \$2.20 per hour plus all gratuities given to them for services rendered. The committee has reduced that to \$2.01 to coincide with the federal wage law. And so we are reducing it from \$2.20 to \$2.01. That is it.

PRESIDENT: Thank you. Senator Schmit, please, on the amendment. No. The question is the adoption of the committee amendments. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 25 ayes, 1 nay, Mr. President, on adoption of the committee amendments.
