SPEAKER BARRETT: Thank you. Senator Coordsen, would you care to speak? Senator Hall.

SENATOR HALL: Question.

SPEAKER BARRETT: The question has been called. It won't be necessary, yours is the last light. Senator Lamb, would you care to close on your motion to bracket?

SENATOR LAMB: Yes, Mr. President, members, you know, it's really amazing. You know, this problem, this problem with this part of the nonresident tuition law has been in effect for years and it has been working in this unfair manner and the people out there...some of those people out there behind the glass have known about it for a long time and they have not tried to correct it, have not corrected it. You know, and all this time they have left it on there because it was unofficial reorganization portion of the school law. You know, that is not something that is just recent. This thing that we have brought to light about the unfairness of this law is not...it's not recent, it's been happening. It's been happening. Now, all of a sudden, we get the promises we are going to correct it, all of a sudden. I don't understand it. I don't know if that's going to happen. I think the prudent thing is to let this committee handle this, as well as the other school issues, over the summer, over the summer, let this group study the whole thing. As you noted, this is not just one year now. This is more than a year. This is permanent and so this is going to be in effect whether or not the...the committee that has been appointed comes up with any other solutions about other problems in the...in the school issue. But this is now going to be permanent. I say let's just wait until next January. There are no kids, you know, I feel comfortable in saying there are no young people not going to be educated. You all know that's the way it's going to work. You all know there is not going to be a student that is going to be denied going to high school next year if this does not get passed this session. So I would ask you to bracket the bill.
