CLERK: Mr. President, on 769 I have E & R amendments pending. E & R, Senator.

PRESIDENT: Senator Scott Moore.

SENATOR MOORE: Mr. Chairman, I move we adopt the E & R amendments to LB 769.

PRESIDENT: You have heard the motion. All in favor say aye. Opposed nay. They are adopted.

CLERK: Nothing further on that bill, Senator.

SENATOR MOORE: I move we advance LB 769.
