SENATOR HABERMAN: Mr. President, the motion...the amendment reduces the A bill 20 percent. I ask that the motion be adopted.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Any discussion on the Haberman motion? If not, those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Have you all voted? Record.

CLERK: 26 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the motion to adopt Senator Haberman's amendment.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Motion adopted. Senator Haberman. Those in favor of the readvancement of the bill please say aye. Opposed no. Carried. Mr. Clerk.

CLERK: Mr. President, the next bill for consideration on Final Reading this morning is 492. Mr. President, Senator Nelson, you had an amendment printed, Senator. I understand you want to withdraw that, the one that was on page 1900.

SENATOR NELSON: Correct.

CLERK: Then there was one on 2100, Senator. I understand you want to withdraw that one as well?

SENATOR NELSON: Correct.

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Nelson and Ashford would move to return 492 to Select File for specific amendment. The amendment is on page 2160 of the Journal.

SPEAKER BARRETT: Senator Nelson.

SENATOR NELSON: Mr. Speaker, members of the body, I move to return this bill back to Select File. First might I tell you the reason that I have to do it. About a week ago we had Final Reading and Chris up and decided to get married on me. So Chris had drawn up the amendments and they were not printed yet. She was off for the day before the wedding and the Speaker ran the bills through that did not have amendments on it. So I certainly did not intend to have to bring this bill back on Final Reading. These are technical amendments. They are brought to us by the workmen's comp court, trial attorneys and the labor...I'm sorry. Can people hear me?
