

PRESIDENT: All right.

SENATOR MILLER: Mr. President and members, Senator Baack asked me to amend this bill, and in the committee amendments, he had moved, if you have your map out of this different boundaries of the educational service units, he had moved and made an amendment to the committee amendments to put Morrill County into ESU 13 from ESU 12. After that was discussed with the people that are affected in that area, both in 12 and in 13, the school districts would rather wait and see what happens during the first year they opt out, and then go through the boundary change process as prescribed in LB 688. So if you would adopt this Baack amendment, you would keep things as they presently are, Morrill County being in ESU 12. I would move the amendment.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, on that motion? Do you wish to waive closing, Senator Miller? The question is the adoption of the Baack amendment. All those in favor vote aye, opposed nay. Record, Mr. Clerk, please.

CLERK: 28 ayes, 0 nays, Mr. President, on the adoption of Senator Baack's amendment.

PRESIDENT: The Baack amendment is adopted. May I explain to you, ladies and gentlemen, that I understand some of the phones from your phone to the phone at this desk are not working, some of them. So if you don't get an answer, perhaps you might look up to see if it is functioning properly. If not, let us know. Thank you. Do you have something further on this bill?

CLERK: Mr. President, Senator Lamb would move to bracket the bill until January 10, 1988.

PRESIDENT: Senator Lamb, please.

SENATOR LAMB: Mr. President and members, this is my method of telling you that I don't believe this bill is in proper form for passage at this time. There are going to be a lot of objections to the bill. Now it is making some comprehensive changes in the ESU's statutes, that I hope you are aware of those changes. Now for one thing, of course, it includes all counties in the ESU system and at one time we granted some of the counties the option of voting themselves out, and a number of counties did vote themselves out. This does not ask them if they want to be back in. It just merely puts them in. Now individual school
